## Research Experience

- 1999 Qualitative research among gay men with children. Worked extensively with 35 gay
- 2001 families residing along the Eastern Seaboard of the U.S., both rural and urban, to understand the experience of being a relative when heterosexual reproduction does not define family. Conducted research with lawyers who handle same sex adoptions, with adoption agency officials who place children in same sex homes, with social workers, advocates, and volunteer organizations devoted to the needs of same sex families, and with the children of gay men.
- 2003 Qualitative research surrounding sexually transmitted disease and its prevention in
- 2006 Baltimore Maryland. Using ethnographic field methods, I attempted to follow subjects as they moved from carceral institutions through in-house drug treatment centers and back into community social networks to understand the social factors that place subjects at a heightened risk for HIV and STDs. Conducted in-depth interviews with subjects seeking treatment for chemical dependency, a group recognized as being at a heightened risk for sexually transmitted infections. Conducted interviews with clinicians and care providers in the “free” std clinics run by the Baltimore Department of Health. Spent time in medical and epidemiological seminars where STD prevention is discussed to understand the institutional imagination of the social world of STDs.
- Future I am currently developing a project in conjunction with Professor Lori Leonard, Bloomberg School of Public Health, that looks at the experience of soldiers returning from the Iraq war. I am particularly interested in the social legacy of concussive force injuries and the development of new therapeutic techniques for neurological rehabilitation.
